50 Years Ago-1967

- W.L. Morton became the first university faculty member in Canada to take his seat on the Board of Governors.
- The university's first Convocation was held outside on June 2, 1967.
- The first undergraduate to receive a degree was Gary Aitken, who later joined the faculty in Modern Languages.
- Ground was broken in July for the construction of Lady Eaton College.
- By late 1967, work was completed on a floodlit playing field, quartermile track and four tennis courts.
- A proposal to build a pedestrian bridge across the river was rejected by the Ontario Government's Department of University Affairs. An identical proposal to build a site services "utilities" corridor with a pedestrian deck was re-submitted and quickly approved.

Names of Honour

McKeiver Garden -Established 1999

As one follows Founders Walk on the Symons Campus along the east side of the Athletic Centre, the Eugene McKeiver Garden nestles against the east wall of the building with a view to the Otonabee River. Gene McKeiver was an immensely popular and respected member of the Grounds crew, serving from 1966-1999. He made an immense contribution to the early development of what was then known as the Nassau Campus.

As a young staff member in the late 1970s I got to know 'Genie', partly through my association with various managers of The Commoner student pub. Gene was a constructive and helpful resource to these individuals and he kept a thoughtful and watchful eye on the safety and well-being of those who worked and lived in the building. His trademark cap was always worn askew. And when you encountered him on campus, you were met with an infectious humour wed to common sense and decency. It was best not to be in a rush during these encounters.

His retirement reception was hosted by Athletics Director Paul Wilson. Gene was welcomed as an Honorary Member of the Trent University Alumni Association, the dedication of the garden was announced and guests included Founding President Tom Symons and an old time fiddler from Douro. It was a rollicking celebration of a wonderful citizen of our university. In 2000 Eugene McKeiver received the Trent University Eminent Service Award. It was noted that he took absolute pride in his work and was an inspiration to students, staff and faculty. He died in January of this year. His funeral service included a tribute from fellow retiree Paul Wilson.
